Buyers: Packeteers were the major contenders whilst Loose Tea Traders operated selectively.

LEAF-CTC:

Brokens: Best and below best types sold well at generally around last levels. Mediums met with less demand and eased in value. Plain and poorer sorts witnessed a limited demand and suffered large withdrawals.

Fannings: Clean bright liquoring sorts met with a fairly good demand and sold at firm to slightly easier rates. Plain and poorer types met with a weaker market and mostly remained unsold.

Dust: Well made good liquoring descriptions met with a fairly good demand and sold at firm to occasionally little dearer rates. Others were generally firm to little easier following quality. CD's were a strong feature.

Comment: Well made good liquoring types were well absorbed by the Blenders. Others met with less demand. Withdrawals continue to be heavy especially in the plainer category. Re-printed teas were neglected.
