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# Tea Auctioneers since 1948 TEA MARKET REPORT – Sale 01 held on Monday, 18<sup>th</sup> May, 2020

CTC LEAF: 17,279 packages of Current Season teas and 24 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with a good but selective demand.

BROKENS: The best Brokens on offer were well sought after and these ranged between Tk.230/- and Tk.240/-. Below best sold between Tk.220/- and Tk.230/-. Others which were lower in quality sold between Tk.200/- and Tk.210/-. BLF teas sold between Tk.140/- and Tk.170/- with fair withdrawals. FANNINGS: Well made good liquoring Fannings elicited good support and generally sold in line with quality, prices ranging between Tk.228/- and Tk.233/-whilst below best fetching prices between Tk.220/- and Tk.225/-. The remainder met with fair interest and these ranged between Tk.195/- and Tk.205/-. BLF teas saw some interest but ranged between Tk.140/- and Tk.170/-.

CTC DUST: 2,757 packages of Current Season teas and 2 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a good demand. Ds and CDs met with a fairly good

competition and sold at a range between Tk.235/- and Tk.250/-. Others also sold well in line with quality. However, plain/BLF teas met with less demand with fair withdrawals. Blenders lent strong support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: This was the first sale of the season which took place at the Bangabandhu Conference Hall, World Trade Center, Chittagong after an interval of two months where strict social distancing was maintained. However, owing to curtailment of movement because of the prevailing COVID-19 epidemic, out-station buyers could not be present. Inspite of these constraints, a good market prevailed whereby the bulk of the offerings could be disposed off at an average of Tk.218.79. Both Blenders and Loose tea buyers were operating in good strength for the best teas on offer. However, Plain teas particularly BLFs were mostly withdrawn owing to lack of bids.

Dusts sold well.



Sri Lanka

Good demand continued to persist on all sorts of leaf grades. Very limited weight of brighter sorts were on offer this week and were absorbed at irregularly around last levels. The good and the better medium categories were at firm to dearer prices based on quality and competition. Select medium category teas were traded at Rs 3 to 5 higher than last whilst the quantum of teas in this category settled at steady levels. Plainer categories too were around last. Once again the major blenders were forceful in their buying in all categories except for the plainer varieties. The market saw some selective buying from the western India buyers Some upcountry packateers too bought the good and better medium teas. The other internal buyers continued to be selective. Exporters continued to operate on the better medium, medium and the plainer sorts actively.

## MOMBASA SALE 19- 11<sup>TH</sup> /12<sup>TH</sup> MAY, 2020

Fair general demand for the 176,925 packages (11,839,272.00 kilos) in the market at irregularly easier rates. However, 14.20% were neglected. The best BP1s available met an irregular enquiry varying between steady to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC14 while brighter sorts held firm to USC20 easier with medium categories a weak feature and shed USC2 to USC36 with some lines neglected but a few improved invoices advanced by up to USC5. Lower mediums saw better absorption gaining USC2 to USC4 with plainer descriptions USC7 to USC10 dearer but some invoices were unsold. Best PF1s in the market appreciated by USC6 to USC15 with brighter types irregular and varied between steady to USC5 dearer to easier by up to USC3 and some invoices were unsold. Medium sorts shed USC2 to USC6 and many lines remained without bids particularly towards the close while lower mediums met an irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC5 above previous levels to easier by up to USC10 and some lines were neglected with plainer descriptions discounted by USC8 to USC14 and some teas remained unsold especially towards the close. Pakistan Packers showed strong support with more and useful interest from Sudan. Afghanistan were active but selective with Kazakhstan, other CIS states and Bazaar active but at lower levels. There was reduced participation from Egyptian Packers, Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries, UK and Russia with some select activity from Iran. Somalia were more active at the lower end of the market.
