Brokens: Select few well made good liquoring types offered sold well at firm to little dearer rates. Rests were a little easier.


Fannings: A small weight of the cleaner types available were actively supported by all sections of the market and sold at firm to little dearer rates. Others were generally a little easier.

New Season Teas: (2021/22): A total of 3476 pkgs were offered which includes 2754 pkgs from North Bengal. There was a good demand mainly from the Loose Tea Traders and prices generally ranged between Tk 220/360 per kg. Teas from the Northern district however, were neglected.

Green Tea: 10 Packages were offered which mostly sold at between Tk. 1250/1750 per kg. (Sold by Purba Bangla Brokers Limited)

FLASH:

YELLOW TEA: This was the first time in the history of Chattogram Tea Auction that a small parcel of YELLOW TEA was offered by Brindabon Tea Estate owned by Green Valley Plantation Limited. Valued at Tk. 6500/= per kg., the lot was sold in the auction for Tk. 8300/= following competition. M/s. Gupta Tea House from Sreemongal was the buyer of this lot. (Sold by Purba Bangla Brokers Limited.)

Dust: Met with a good demand and generally sold at firm to little dearer rates following quality.

On-Line Tea Auction in Chattogram:

The first ever On-line Tea Auction was started in Chattogram today (Sale No. 42) where approximate 12,000 kg. teas of various Estates were offered. Though on an experimental basis, the E-Auction attracted widespread interest from all sections of the market. The On-line Tea Auction was inaugurated by Member(Finance & Trade) Bangladesh Tea Board Dr. Nazmeen Kawser Chowdhury.

Comment: This was the concluding Sale of the season which ended on an exciting note. Offerings were small and apart from teas from the Northern district which were mostly withdrawn, rest were all sold. There was a fair weight of new season manufacture on offer which however, sold below broker's price idea.
