Brokens: Well made good liquoring types sold well at rates Tk 3/5 below last. Select few lines of popular types however, occasionally tended dearer. Mediums and the plainer types, met with less demand and were easier. Teas from the Northern District met with improved enquiry.

Fannings: Best and the below best types were a fairly good market but eased by Tk 3/5 from last. Mediums and the plainer types were easier and suffered fair withdrawals. Northern District teas however, sold well.
