Buyers: Blenders were dominant whilst Loose Tea Traders lent fairly good support.

LEAF-CTC:

Brokens: Well made good liquoring types were a fairly strong market and sold at firm to little dearer rates following quality. Medium and plainer types met with an improved demand and ruled firm to often little dearer than last.

Fannings: Best and below best types were again a fairly strong market and sold at firm to occasionally dearer rates following competition. Medium and the plainer types sold well at firm to dearer rates.

Comment: Offerings witnessed a somewhat better demand with blenders operating in strength. Prices for most descriptions were firm to little dearer. Dusts were also a good market. Withdrawals were less and generally confined to the poorer types on offer.
