Quality: Similar to last.

Demand: Less demand at easier rates with heavy withdrawals.

Buyers: Blenders were active. Loose Tea Traders continued to operate selectively.

LEAF-CTC:

Brokens: A limited weight of the well made good liquoring types met with a good demand and sold at firm to occasionally slightly dearer rates. Below best types eased by Tk 3/5 following quality. Others met with less demand at easier rates of Tk 5/7. Teas from the Northern District met with a poor demand at rates Tk 10/12 below last with considerable withdrawals.

Fannings: Best types sold well at generally firm rates. Others were easier by Tk 3/5 with some withdrawals. Plainer types were heavily discounted and often neglected.

Dust: Well made good liquoring types sold well at around last levels. Others were easier. Plainer types were difficult of sale.

Comment: Demand was mostly confined to the well made good liquoring types offered. Others witnessed a rather poor demand at lower levels with large withdrawals. Dusts were easier except for the clean good liquoring types which were firm.
