Quality: Mostly plain and end season variety.

Demand: Fair demand at generally easier rates.

Buyers: Blenders lent fair support whilst Loose Tea Traders were rather selective.

LEAF-CTC:

Brokens: A limited weight of the better types offered sold well at generally easier rates than last. Mediums met with a limited demand and eased by Tk. 3/5. Plainer types were about steady.

Fannings: A small weight of the cleaner types available met with a fairly good demand and sold at rates firm to around Tk 5/= lower than last. Others met with selective demand at easier rates of Tk 3/5. Plainer types mostly sold at around last levels.

Dust: A handful of the best types offered met with a good demand and generally sold at firm rates. Others met with only a fair demand and sold at easier rates with a fair weight remaining unsold. CD's were easier.

Comment: Blenders continue to be the major contenders and accounted for most of the teas sold. Prices were generally easier except for select few popular well made types which were about firm. Teas from the Northern District however, sold at around last levels. Withdrawals were substantial.
