### The culture and preparation of tea

In North-East India field experiment and experience have shown that soil disturbance (*per se*) does little to increase the crop, but that the removal of weeds does well. At one time tea estate were deep hoed to 9 in. each dry season and light hoed six or more times during the year to a depth of 5 in. Trenching and the burial of prunings at 18 in. were customary. Nowadays the cultivation consists of one round of scrape hoe in the spring, whilst the boles of the bushes are cleaned round once in February. The weeds are sickled three or four times over the rest of the year. The prunings are left on the surface to rot, for burial brings no increased benefit. The wide spread of the bushes and the canopy of shade trees do much to keep the weed growth in check.
