Demand: Fair demand at irregularly firm to generally little easier rates.

Buyers: Blenders were the major operators. Loose Tea Traders were selective.

LEAF-CTC:

Brokens: Fairly good demand for the handful of the better types available which ruled little easier than last. Others met with only a limited demand. Plain types were generally neglected.

Fannings: A nominal weight of the better types offered sold readily at around last levels. Rests were easier and suffered large withdrawals.

Bought-Leaf Teas: Met with selective demand.

Dust: Met with only a fair demand. Prices were generally easier by Tk. 5/10 and there were fairly large withdrawals.

Comment: Quality on offer was generally plain which met with only a fair demand mainly from the blenders at rates little easier than last. Select few lines of the better types on offer however, sold well. Withdrawals were quite substantial. Re-printed teas continued to be neglected. Dusts were again a weaker feature.
