The culture and preparation of tea

In Java a similar procedure to the above is followed. In Ceylon the length of the pruning cycle ranges from eighteen months to two years in the low country, three to five years in the high-grown areas, and the periodic cut is usually lower than in India. However there is a tendency towards higher pruning in Ceylon now, which is considered preferable to the low cut. In South India it has long been the custom to prune at heights comparable with those in Assam and to run four, five or even six years between prunings, the longer periods being used at the higher altitudes.

In China and Japan the young leaf is plucked when each flush is complete and the biggest pluckings are made in the spring. Although several leaves are taken the growth is not coarse because the individual leaves are small. Only three to five plucking a year are made.
