**The culture and preparation of tea**

In Ceylon, after rather heavy prune, the bush is left to grow till the shoots are so long that the new wood has turned from green to red at the base. This new growth is then plucked back or, tipped to about 4in. above the pruning level. A second 'tipping', still higher, may follow, after which plucking begins and this is above a big leaf. Hence to pluck two leaves and a bud, three leaves are allowed to grow and the lowest leaf is left on the bush at plucking time. Thus two plucking systems are presented, top-pruning annually or biennially as in Assam, followed by flat plucking, against heavier pruning at longer intervals, followed by 'tip-ping', which resembles the Assam top-prune, and then plucking above leaf as in Ceylon. Perhaps with the lighter pruning in months to two years, closer plucking might pay.
