**Quality:** Showed seasonal decline. There were however, a limited weight of clean bright liquorizing types on offer.

**Demand:** Good general demand.

**Buyers:** Blenders operated in strength. Loose Tea Traders lent fairly good support.

**LEAF-CTC:**

**Brokens:** A limited weight of well made good liquorizing types on offer met with a strong market and appreciated substantially in value. Below best and the mediums sold well at firm rates. Plainer types were little easier whilst poor end season types were neglected.

**Fannings:** Likewise, a small weight of the best types available were keenly competed for by all sections of the market and sold at considerably higher level than last. Below best and the mediums were firm. Plainer types were easier. Poorer sorts were mostly neglected.

**Bought-Leaf Teas:** Met with a good demand and sold at firm to little easier rates following quality.

**Dust:** A small weight of the clean bright liquorizing types offered met with a strong market and sold at dearer rates. Others were firm. Plain and the poorer types were easier with some withdrawals.

**Comment:** A limited weight of the clean good liquorizing types available witnessed a strong demand and moved up considerably in value following competition. Others were generally firm to little easier following quality. Plain and end season types were mostly withdrawn owing to lack of demand. Blenders accounted for majority of the teas sold.
