LEAF-CTC:

Brokens: A small weight of well made good liquoring types on offer met with fairly strong demand and sold at rates firm to little dearer than last. Mediums and the plainer types were firm. Poor types met with selective interest and suffered fair withdrawals.

Fannings: A small weight of brighter liquoring types available were readily absorbed at firm to little dearer rates following quality. Others met with good demand at firm rates. Poorer types witnessed some withdrawals.

Bought-Leaf Teas: Better liquoring types were readily absorbed at firm to little dearer rates. Others were generally firm.

Dust: Clean bright liquoring types met with a fairly strong demand and sold at firm to little dearer rates. Rest were firm. Plainer types met with selective interest and suffered some withdrawals. Blenders were active.

Comment: A small weight of the bright good liquoring types available met with a fairly strong demand and realised firm to little dearer rates. Others were generally firm. Poor end season types generally remained unsold owing to lack of interest. A limited weight of better liquoring B/L Teas sold readily at firm to little dearer rates.
