## MARKET REPORT ON SALE NO 03 HELD ON MAY 11, 2026

Offering comprising of 27,093 packages leaf met good demand at about firm to easier rates than last. Withdrawals stood at 11% against 18% last week.

**LEAF:** Best and good brokens were firm to easier by Tk.2/4. Others eased similarly. Selective best brokens sold between Tk.316/- – Tk.429/-. Northern brokens were in good demand at firm to often dearer rates.

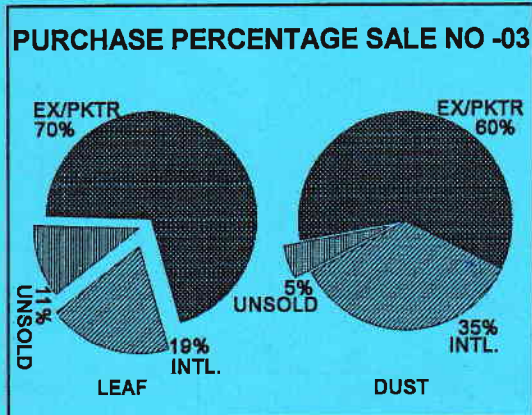
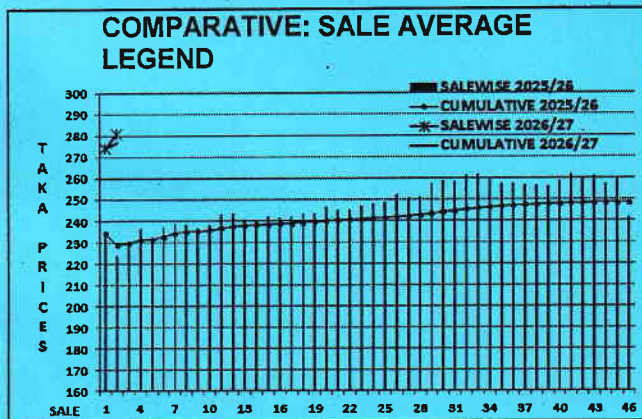
Well made fannings were generally firm to a little easier. Good and mediums were easier by Tk.2/3 from last. Plainer types were often easier. Selective best varieties sold around Tk.314/- – Tk.359/-. Northern fannings were well sought after and met better rates than last.

**DUST:** 5,266 were packages on offer. There was a good general demand with most types selling at firm to dearer rates, particularly clean grainy types and the well made CD's. Withdrawals stood at 5% against 15% last week.

**SUPPLEMENT:** Offerings stood at 1,067 packages 83% were sold with only 17% remaining unsold.

**OLD SEASON:** A handful sold between Tk.245/- – Tk.251/-. Majority remained unsold.

**The culture and preparation of tea**

In countries like England and Australia, where people are heavy tea drinkers, the food value of the tea beverage taken daily forms an appreciable fraction of the diet. A black tea infusion contains, in addition to caffeine and oxidized polyphenols, small quantities of protein bodies and carbohydrates. Neither are, however, present in sufficient quantity to be of appreciable value in the normal diet of the average person. A cup of tea even when taken with milk contains only about to grains of proteins. This amount is small when it is considered that the average man requires 1,300 grains protein each day, and usually consumes much more.

The actual calorific value of a cup of tea, containing 6 fluid oz. has been put at 4 calories, which may be compared with a similar cup of coffee which supplies 11 and a cup of milk which supplies about 107 calories. The calorie is used as a measure of energy turnover in animals, and an active man requires of heat when burned must be provided to maintain that energy output. A cup of tea containing a tablespoon of milk (10 calories) and one lump of sugar (25 calories) yields about 40 calories.
